## Penitential Disciplines of Lent

*"The Christian faithful, during Lent, are clearly conscious of the need to turn the mind towards those realities which really count, which require Gospel commitment and integrity of life which, through self denial of those things which are superfluous, are translated into good works and solidarity with the poor and needy"* (Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy, #125).

In addition to choosing their own penitential practices, Catholics are also asked to observe the practices of fast and abstinence during the 40 days of Lent. The Lenten Fast and Abstinence Regulations are as follows:

1. Everyone 14 years of age or over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
2. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. (The obligation of fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59th birthday.)
3. Fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday means eating only one full, meatless meal. Two other smaller, meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices, are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.
4. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices



## Formación Cristiana

## Disciplinas Penitenciales de la Cuaresma

*"El pueblo cristiano advierte claramente que durante la Cuaresma hay que dirigir el espíritu hacia las realidades que son verdaderamente importantes; que hace falta un esfuerzo evangélico y una coherencia de vida, traducida en buenas obras, en forma de renuncia a lo superfluo y suntuoso, en expresiones de solidaridad con los que sufren y con los necesitados"*. (Directorio sobre la Piedad Popular y la Liturgia, no. 125).

Además de escoger sus propias prácticas penitenciales los católicos también deben observar las prácticas prescritas de ayuno y abstinencia durante los cuarenta días de Cuaresma. Las regulaciones para el ayuno y la abstinencia cuaresmal son las siguientes:

1. Toda persona de 14 años o más está obligada a abstenerse de comer carne el Miércoles de Ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma.
2. Las personas de 18 años o más, y que no hayan cumplido los 59 años de edad, están obligadas al ayuno el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. (La obligación del ayuno cesa al cumplir los 59 años de edad).
3. El ayuno del Miércoles de Ceniza y del Viernes Santo se entiende como ingerir una sola comida fuerte al día y sin carne. Si fuese necesario para evitar el decaimiento se pueden hacer dos pequeñas comidas adicionales, que no contengan carne, siempre y cuando las dos juntas no igualen una comida principal. En estos dos días no está permitido ingerir ningún alimento entre comidas, pero los líquidos, incluso la leche y los jugos de fruta, sí están permitidos. Esta ley no obliga si llegara a afectar seriamente la salud y la habilidad de trabajar de la persona.
4. Los católicos no deben de evadir sin mayores razones estas mínimas y obligatorias prácticas penitenciales.
